Nature, Scope and Extent of Responsibilities:

I am owner and principal of a private law practice in Dallas, Texas. I focus on saving careers and concentrate in the areas of Professional License Defense, Security Clearance Representation, Military Officer Resignations and adult and juvenile criminal defense. Additionally, I represent and defend service members from all branches facing involuntary mobilization and recall to active duty, adverse administrative eliminations and adverse separation Boards and actions, and offenses charged under the Uniform Code of Military Justice, UCMJ, and at court-martial. I also defend Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines and Coast Guard personnel, active and reserve, charged with Non-Judicial punishment. Many of the above actions can derail or ruin an otherwise promising career. I previously served for nearly five years as an Assistant District Attorney and chief prosecutor with the Dallas County District Attorney's Office, then headed a prosecution division with the Tarrant County, Texas, District Attorney's office before entering private practice in February 1993.
